May Newton, a girl 17 years old, of Sprague, Washington Territory, committed suicide in Portland, last Wednesday night.

The funeral of Tom Thumb took place at Bridgeport, Conn., with Masonic ceremonies, 10 000 persons viewing the remains.

The regular annual stage robbery took place in Southern Oregon Tuesday night of last week, eight miles from Glendale: the robbers got away with the entire mail and Wells, Fargo & Co's treasure box containing

"General Grant dropped dead in New York," was the signal agreed upon by the striking telegraph operators, and when that was heard along the wires, 14,000 operators walked out and left the offices to run themselves.

The apportionment of the state school fund of Marion county, has been made by Superintendent Gregg. The total amount to be distributed was \$4123 10, and the number of scholars is 5933, and each one of these draws seventy cents.


