Seattle is to have a water power and electric light. The fall sown wheat in the Willamette valley looks splendid.

The Waitsburg, W. T., council is called upon to decide a \$1000 liquor license.

Many of the men in Washington territory say they will not furnish poll tax money for their wives. No poll tax, no vote.

Says the Yakima Record: In the hills above Joseph Sinclair's the snow is four feet deep. Not a flake in any of the valleys about here.

Some of the citizens of Seattle propose to check the Chinese growth in that city. They are signing an agreement not to lease central property to the heathen.

Seattle appears to be unsafe along the dock. Half a dozen or more men have tumbled into the water there during the past week. Two more are now reported.

A train of 140 teams recently arrived in the Palouse country from Texas, and families which came with them are scattering through various parts of Washington territory.

The Goldendale, W. T., Gazette says: Within a few miles of Happy Home station about 13,000 sheep are being herded, most of them are sound and in excellent condition.

The steamers of the railway company operating on Snake river have been put into winter quarters. They leave about 10,000 bushels of grain in the warehouses along the stream.

Grant County, Oregon, carries off the palm this year as being the first to make payment of state taxes. There was deposited the sum of \$2000 on Thursday with Treasurer Hirsch in favor of said county.

Says the Salem, Oregon, Statesman: We observed several new red flags hanging from buildings in different parts of the city yesterday. This indicates that the scarlet fever has again made its appearance.

Every paper in the country is now running that old lie about a subscriber crawling into a hollow log, getting pinched, and feeling mean enough about cheating the printer to reduce himself in size so that he could crawl out again.

Chirps the Waitsburg Times: J. V. Crawford, our city clerk, who assessed the property holders of this burg, estimate that the assessments will reach \$175,000. How is that for a population of less than 600 inhabitants.

C. Magruder's store at Central Point, Oregon, was entered Friday night and robbed of \$675 in money—\$75 of which belonged to Wm. Tyler, laying in the till, says the Jacksonville Times. The thief cut out a pane of glass and thus gained an entrance. No clue has been discovered as yet.

J. F. Jones, engineer and superintendent of mines for Oregon Improvement company, arrived last Thursday, says the Tacoma Ledger, and ordered the mines to be shut down and abandoned, which is a death blow to Wilkeson. The live stock and other material is to be sent to their mines on Green river, where they expect to put out about 100 tons of coal per day next spring.

Of the sound country, the Boston Journal says: "It would be odd if there were not to grow up on this vast Puget Sound a city of a quarter of a million inhabitants. Seattle has the site for it, and her commerce will be literally at her feet, and will come to her from all quarters of the world. From the shores of Elliott Bay to those of Lake Washington there is a handsome extent of land which seems predestined as a 'city site.'"

The town of Toledo is located on the west bank of the Cowlitz river, about forty miles from its mouth, where it empties into the Columbia river, and is seven miles from the nearest railroad station, which is Winlock, on the N. P. R. R. The town was laid out years ago by Captain Joseph Keellog, Cowlitz prairie is one mile from Toledo, a beautiful stretch of land seven miles long by two and one-half wide. It is mostly timbered land, excepting little prairies along the river. There is a prairie about twenty-five miles from here called Klickitat prairie.

Of the recent overflowing of the Nooksack river the Whitcomb Beehive says: The Nooksack river last week was on a regular bender. The heavy fall of snow succeeded by four days of constant rain swelled the waters of the hitherto placid Nooksack to a magnitude unknown or unheard of within the memory of the oldest inhabitant. Many farms in the valley were wholly inundated. At Nooksack crossing the flood extended out over the low lands, doing great damage to property and live stock.

Many farmers throughout the valley are rendered homeless, having lost their grain, fruit, provisions and in many cases their live stock.
