

STATE AND TERRITORIAL.

The first marriage ceremony in the National Park, was performed at the Mammoth Hot Springs on the 13th ult. Rev. George Comfort united in wedlock, Mr. Oscar S. Swanson and Miss Barbara G. Henderson.

Mail agents on the Northern Pacific now run through between Helena and Spokane Falls in one run, requiring about 24 hours. They lay over in Helena one day and two nights, and in Spokane Falls three days and two nights.

The Whatcom, W. T., Reveille predicts that in the failure of the Whatcom townsites owners and the colony to effect a settlement of their affairs, city lots can be obtained for \$10 each but in the event of such settlement, they will sell at from \$500 to \$1500 apiece.

Says the Astorian of Thursday: Yesterday was the coldest day of the season. The wind blew in keen, icy puffs from the northeast. The warmest clothing was brought out, skates were oiled preparatory to a visit to Clatsop, and buckwheat cakes and honey were in prime favor.

The Tacoma Ledger's Lakeview correspondent says: Our postmaster wrote to Portland recently, asking to have a townsite laid off at the depot. The land company said they would consider the matter, but our people fail to see a townsite, for the land will not grow even grass, besides not having any water convenient.

The passes over the highest ranges in Montana have an altitude of only about 6000 feet above the sea level—no greater than the plains of Cheyenne, Wyoming. Nearly all the arable valleys of Montana average from 500 to 2000 lower than the most fertile ones of Colorado or Utah. Montana's highest peak would barely reach timber line in Colorado.
