It needs to be fed with some divisor that contains little nutrition, and for this purpose grain straw is better than hay, as it is less likely to cloy the animal.

Stone or Cement Floors for Dairies. There is no floor for a dairy so good as flagstone and cement between the joints. It will not absorb milk or cream as board or brick will do, is easily cleaned, and is always easily kept cool in summer. The cost of a cement floor is not much, if any, greater than that from other material that will not give half so good satisfaction. The dairy floor should be even with the surface of the soil, or but very slightly above it.
