New French Microphone.

A new microphone is being exhibited before the French Academy of Sciences. It detects at a great distance the approach of a ship, whether an armored vessel or a torpedo boat, and gives its warning with great clearness. It is to be subjected to tests at Cherbourg. Some years ago Commander Banare proposed an instrument which he called a hydrophone and by which he was able to hear at a distance of a mile or a mile and a half vibrations produced by a screw of a torpedo boat, or the more regular beat of the screw of a large battleship. It consisted of a water-tight box, the vibratory plate being inside to prevent the pressure of the water from acting upon it too directly. The wires from the transmitter were carried first to a float to make sure the transmitter would be continually immersed; from the float the wires were caried to a receiver on a ship or on the shore. Thus with two or three miles of wire it becomes possible to receive warning of the approach of a vessel from four to five miles distant.




