declared on a basis of equal rates all round, but the lines between St. Paul and Chicago were still disturbed by local troubles, and the combination of rates east and west of St. Paul made Chicago \$57.75 first-class and \$47.75 second-class. This last difficulty in the way of complete restoration of standard fares has at fast been adjusted, and, on April 25th. through rates to Chicago and points west were rebuilt to normal figures by all lines, so that now it costs no more to travel by way of the Southern Pacific through California than by the Northern lines, through Vancouver, Helena or Spokane.—Ploneer Press.
