Water Ordinance No. 191.
Section 11. No owner or occupant of any building or premises into which water is introduced shall be allowed to supply water to other families, or for any other purpose than stated in his application. If found so doing the supply of water may be shut off.
Sec. 12. No person shall be allowed to take or use water from any tap on the street, or from any premises for which they have not paid and who are not duly recorded in the superintendent's books as a consumer of said city.
Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing, shall upon conviction before the recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than \$1 nor more than \$5 for each and every offense.
