Fibret Crop.

In some districts of Italy the fibret crop is said to rival in commercial importance the produce of the vine. These delicious nuts are grown on bushes planted in groups that are from fifteen feet to twenty-five feet apart, so as to insure the access of plenty of light and air. They thrive best in a deep clayey soil, and the planting in Italy takes place in November and December of slips from the mother plant. The bushes fruit in the third year. They are pruned annually. Plantations are found nearly 100 years old and the bushes in good health. The fibret is not liable to disease like many other crops, but it suffers severely from hailstorms and cold winds.
