Flags at half-mast, the church bell tolling, the band playing a dirge and citizens crowding the Christian church yesterday were the outward evidences of the lingering respect and affection felt for Privates Frank W. Hibbs and Lewis E. Miller, whose young lives ended while serving their

country in the Philippines. The remains of Hibbs arrived on Tuesday and those of Miller the following day. The heavy boxes containing the hermetically sealed zinc caskets were carried into the church and both they

Burial of Hibbs was in Masonic cemetery and that of Miller in the Happy Valley cemetery, beside the grave of his father, recently deceased. The comrades attended both interments with military ceremonies.
