Creamery Meeting at Carlton.

Carlton will be the scene of a meeting of those interested in the creamery industry throughout this section. This gathering will be held March 20, and will be attended by many of prominence, including Dr. Withycombe, vice-president of the Oregon Agricultural college, 1.00 and General Freight and Passenger Agent C H. Markham, of the Southern Pacific. It is thought that the location presents as favorable an opportunity for the establishment of a creamery as any other in the state, and besides being central possesses another decided advantage-that of good roads. Throughout the entire year it is accessible to the farmers. This is regarded as an important consideration in the establishment 75.00 of a creamery at this point, and one which will argue well for its location. The inability of farmers to deliver milk during the entire season has tended to handicap creameries of several sections, and while everything else seems to be favorable the prospects are generally re garded as not of the best unless the roads leading to it are in good shape.
