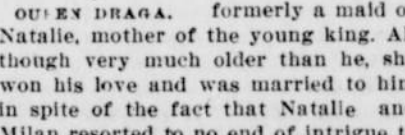

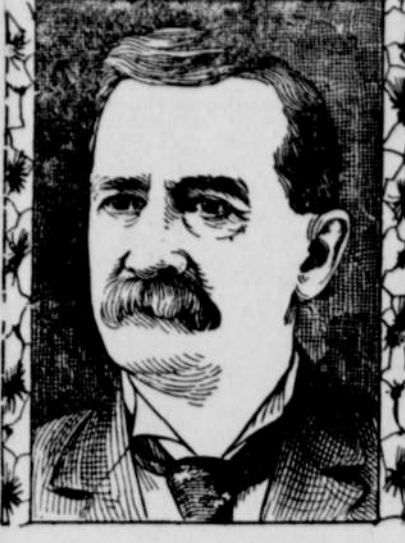
A Starter.

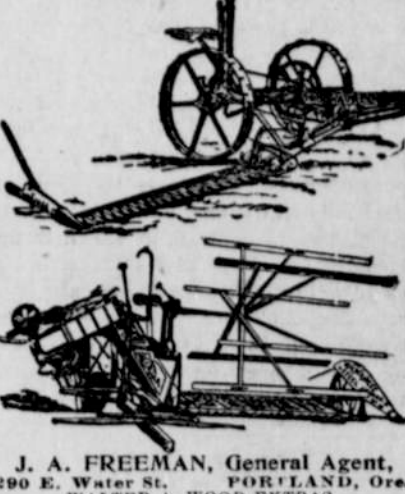
