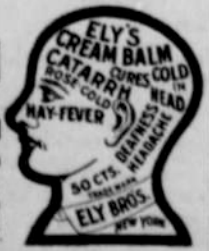
Emmet Fay of McMinnville was a Sunday visitor at P. Casey's. Several of the young people from here attended the dance in Sheridan Friday evening.
