Affairs that required decision by the secretary of war are held back because a major general cannot submit his action for the decision of a junior, and the lieutenant general experiences daily the humiliation of having his orders disapproved, and the movements of troops directed by a junior officer not connected with the line of the army, and who is without that experience with troops in the field that would justify him, under any circumstances, in directing army movements contrary to the judgment of the lieutenant general or either of the three major generals. This demoralization is felt on the Mexican border.
