A very serious accident occurred to John Conlee, of West Chehalem, Wednesday evening about five o'clock, by his team running away. Dr. Calbreath was hastily summoned, and found the right thigh fractured, left arm fractured at the wrist joint, severe scalp wounds, and a fractured rib. Mr. C. is fifty-eight years of age, and has been in ill health for the past three years, but is resting as well as could be expected under the circumstances.

At the instance of Senators Dolph and Mitchell an appropriation of \$17,000 was made to cover the expense incident to placing new steel boilers in the fish commissioner's steamer Albatross, and also to defray the cost of taking the vessel to the Pacific coast. The Albatross will leave for San Francisco by way of the straits of Magellan, and will do extensive hydrographic soundings en route. The Pacific food fish have never yet been thoroughly studied, and work will be prosecuted along the coast as far north as the Aleutian and Sea island groups.
