Pity the man in America ten years from this day who has not fixed himself with a farm sufficient to maintain himself and those dependent upou him, as against the millions of artizans and those with no pursuit in life other than earning their bread daily by the sweat of their brow. Commissioner Sparks, has prepared a statement showing disposals of public lands for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1886, from which it appears that the total number of entries embrace an area of 20, 991,967 acres. The amount of money received for this land was \$7,412,797. Original homestead entries cover an area of 9, 145,135 acres. The lists of selections made by railroad companies, under different agents, aggregated 2,311,587 acres. The number of timber culture Asthma, Catarran, Throat & Lung Troubles entries comprise 5,389,309 acres. The remaining are disposed, consisted of military bounty land warrant locations, scrip locations, state selections, wagon Dyspepsia, Liver and Kidney diseases, Rhenroad selections, snd agricultural college selections. Final proof was made upon homestead entries, embracing 2.663,-532 acres, and timber culture entries, covering 141,674 acres. The above locations do not include disposals of lands amounting to 15,562 entries, comprising an area of 11,325,956 acres, on account of which \$1,607,729 were received. Under the head of cash sales are included pre-emption entries, covering 2, 279, 216 acres, and desert land entries, covering 753,688 acres. Mineral entries covering 22,980 acres. Homestead entries commuted to cash entries, covering an area of 1,096,487 acres. This last area is not included in the total area shown to have been disposed of, as it was accounted for when the original homestead entries were made.
