The plans of the general land office, detailed below, are denominated an audacious step, and while it may not have a more effective result than numerous bills before congress it is likely to cause the NPRCo serious embarrassment. Some time since the secretary of the interior decided that no land grant road had earned its grant until it had filed a completed plat of its whole road and land donated. Taking this rule as a guiding principle the law officers of the general land office are preparing a case against the Northern Pacific road, alleging that it is not entitled to the land granted it from Duluth to Puget sound, by reason of its failure to earn those lands and file a plat within the prescribed time. It takes the ground that the road could not earn the entire grant, and upon this hypothesis the general land office will ask the secretary of the interior to declare these lands forfeited and open to settlement. It is expected that this audacious step will be ready for consummation in a few days.
