He urges the mere triumph of skill in the that appropriations should be made and work began at once to fortify the principal seaboard cities against attacks by water. The report says we have a single problem to solve in defending our cities, how to best resist and silence the armored ships and steal guns and mortars of modern construction. It can only be accomplished by guns of equal force to those which any enemy can bring against us, and by torpedoes or submarine mines laid in navigable channels, both so guarded that they can do efficient service when required. We have no guns now which can stop the progress or do any material injury to a well armored ship. The manufacture of the guns is a work of a long time, and they cannot be extemporized when wanted. Torpedoes may be more quickly created, but still time and money are needed for their construction.
