## CURRENT THOUGHT.

It is reported that the ORN Co. have accepted $\$ 200,000$ in full settlement of their claim against Henry Villard.

Congressman Morrison's friends are endeavoring to secure that statesmen's appointment to the chief clerkship of the house for the fiftieth term of eongress.
The wife of editor Keppler of Puck, recently called in a doctor to look at a favorite cat and subsequently was startled to receive a bill for $\$ 22$ for the service of chopping off a portion of the felines tail.
The New York Herald, which has for many years defied competition as a purveyor of news, is now astonishing itself and the country with chunks of solid sense in its editorials.
The democracy claim Minnesota on the tariff for protection plank, while the republicans claim that upon the same issue of tariff Virginia and Indiana have "come over" to them. How does such a swap help the democracy?
The President is very much annoyed because there is only 72 cents of intrinsic value in our standard silver dollar. Senator Leland Stanford once remarked, when the bullion in the dollar was worth 80 cents, that any merchant or banker was not in failing circumstances who had 80 per cent in cash of his liabilities in his vaults. We commend this remark to the careful and prayerful consideration of the President.
The Catholic and Episcopal charge of New York are moving in the matter of suppressing impure literature and sensational papers. We extend them-a cordial greeting and promis of co-operation. The first thing to suppress ought to be the daily reports from European royal circles. For some time past the great wire traversing the deep between the two continents has become so foul from the scandal-
laden electricity that the old clock in the receiving room of the New York office covers its face with its hands day and night, and a moral nausea has become epidemic among the operations.
Col. T. E. Hogg of the OPR Co. now in New York, has purchased the iron steamship Kate Carroll, 619 tons register. She will sail from New York in January, to be placed in the San Francisco and Yaquina trade.

## Household Affairs.

A fine soldering fluid composed of a teaspoonful of chloride of zine dissolved in two ounces of alcohol will not rust and tarnish, and has no bad smell.
Corduroy of rich, soft texture has found favor for upholstering purposes. In a golden shade of green it is affective for dining chairs when leather is beyond the purse of the housewife.
Cranberry Jelly for turkey or game may be made in this way For each pound of cranberries, after washing and sorting, allow half a pint of water and one pound of granulated sugar. Let the sugar and water boil once in a granite or porcelain-lined ket tle ; then add the cranberries, and after boiling point is reached, let them boil for ten minutes. At the end of this time pour in to moulds wet with cold water. Stand for twenty-four hours be
