Brought To Limerick.

Salem Statesman.

The Statesman had a subscriber at East Portland, who owed \$19.50 for subscription to the weekly. He was respectfully reminded of the fact of his delinquency, and asked to remit. He did not respond until pressed and then he flatly refused to pay. The account was put into the hands of Col. S. R. Harrington, who represented Multnomah county in the last legislature, with power to sue, and suit was brought at once. The refractory subscriber was brought to "limerick," and paid the full amount of his bill, together with the costs of the action. Had this effort to bring the wayward brother to time failed, he would have been arrested on the charge of larceny, and allowed to defend himself before the proper authorities of the United States. It is a crime to take papers from the postoffice, and then refuse to pay for them. This paper will not be forced upon any one and it will go a good way to get what is due it. If a man is not able to pay, and does not deny his bill, that is another question.

The last legislature appropriated \$41,000 to pay its own expenses, exclusive of the printing. Of this amount, says the Telegram, \$34,063.75 has been paid out by the state treasurer, and there still remain outstanding warrants which bring the sum up to somewhere in the vicinity of \$40,000, about \$1,000 under the limit set by the legislature. It has been estimated by the secretary of state that the printing will cost near \$10,000; and so the total expense of the late session will approach \$50,000. The expense of the session of two years ago was about \$28,000, exclusive of printing, and of the special session, \$16,000.

The effect of the failure of the deficiency bill will be more serious than is generally believed, inasmuch as it contained provisions for supplying pressing demands for postal cards; stamps, and other items connected with the postal service, the denial of which will, it is expected, seriously embarrass the department and the public. The legal machinery of the government will also be materially disarranged during the remainder of the fiscal year, as no money will be available for jurors, witnesses or marshalls' fees, and perhaps Sparks informers.
