When serving oven meals, cook before 11:00 a. m. and 4:30 p. m. Wash dinner distanatier noon and after 6:30 p. m. In cooking, use least possible number of surface units. Turn off all lights not actually needed between 4:30 and 6:30 p. m. Wash and iron if the morning prior to 11:00 a. m. or after 6:30 p. m.

Businessmen

Turn off or reduce to a minimum all window display and all ornamental lighting between 4:16 and 6:30 p. m. Reduce all air-conditioning and refrigeration during these hours. Reduce use of electrically operated equipment. Cut use of outdoor and indoor electric signs and lighting to minimum between 4:30 and 5:30 p. m.

Industry

Reduce use of electrically operated machinery to a minimum for one hour before 12:00 noon and between 4:30 and 6:30 p. m.
