Turn off or reduce to a minimum all window display and ornamental light between 4:30 and 6:30 p. m. Reduce air conditioning during these hours. Reduce use of electrically operated equipment after 4:30 p. m. Cut use of outdoor and indoor electric signs and lighting to minimum
