Area No. 2

NW one-fourth NE one-fourth Section 25, Township 9 South, Range 3 East W. M. consisting of approximately 500 MBF of old growth Douglas fir.

Before submitting bids the prospective purchasers must secure a copy of the prospectus and bid form from the State Forester, Salem, Oregon, or from Elmer Taylor, state forest inspector, Mehama, Oregon.
