TWO HELD IN FIGHTING

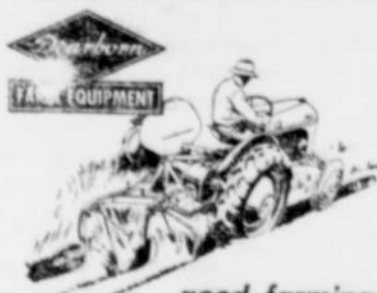
