Cascara bark is a been used and abused by us whites crop which thieves have been, in effect, given a license by law enforcement officers and courts to steal without danger of more than wrist-slapping punishment.

The effect has been to create a tradition that thieving was roght as long as only the property off owners of cascara trees was stolen. Owners who resisted were threatened with fire or firearms.

The thieves, of course, have no concern with conservation. They strip trees completely of their bark, killing them. They start fires that destroy entire stands.

To Protect the Pot of Gold Buyers of cascara bark have also

been too little concerned with the sources of what they buy, especially since growing demand and decreasing supply have made a seller's market.

Cascara bark remains a crime crop in the large part. But now forest land owners, most of all farmer owners of forest land, are demanding their rightful protection at the hands of agencies of the law. Sword fern thrives in the Pacific Northwest. Florists provide its market, which calls for new - growth leaves clean with sharp tips, each at least 25 inches long. The standard bunch has 55 leaves, and 50 bunches are packed to a case.

Tree seeds have never had a better market than they enjoy today. Florists also buy cedar boughs, rhododendrons, moss, Oregon grape, Kinnikinink and other items of the kind.

While the big plants of the woodland are "fattening up" each year, adding layers of wood, spearing toward the sun, there are tiny timber crops on the farm that may make in-

Even moss and skunk cabbage have market possibilities. Ginsing roots, foxglove, peppermint, wild berries, are also prospects.
