Dedication ceremonies are scheduled at the Breitenbush bridge and are sponsored by the Canyon Commercial club headed by Ed Vickers, Idanha, president. The new 17-mile stretch of highway between Detroit and Gates will be formally opened by Douglas McKay.

Nearly 50 persons took part in the queen selection program which was sponsored by the Detroit Women's Civic club with Mrs. Roy Johnson, president.

COUNCIL BUYS STREET OILER

The city council in a special meeting Wednesday night voted to purchase a street oiling device. Cost will be about \$600 or \$700 and delivery

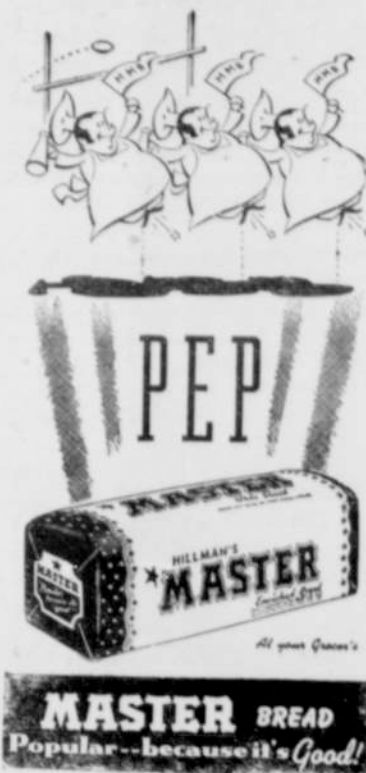
is expected in two weeks.

Decision to buy equipment to fix the streets was the result of failure of the state highway department to do work promised by Aug. 1. The device will be used for patching.

Mayor Harold Kiewer said the de-

cision to have equipment of the city's own would pay for itself in a short time.

Councilmen pointed out that while the state crew was actually in town doing work, no offer was made to continue work on the streets, although \$1000 had been paid for the job in June.

The diversion tunnel, being excavated by the Shea Co., subcontractors and a principal of the construction company, has been drilled about 45 per cent of the way.

Excavations for the towers that will carry the cable buckets is continuing rapidly.

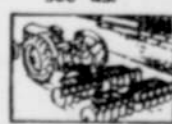
The machine shop has been going ahead rapidly, and the offices will be ready in a few weeks.
