## Elkhorn Road Job on Way

The Gates-Elkhorn road, long-sought route to connect the Little North Fork and the North Santiam Canyon, at last has gotten out of the hoped-for stage.

The four-mile road, which shortens the distance to shopping centers for many families and resorters in the beautiful canyon just north of Gates and Mill City by 11 miles, one way.

County Commissioner Roy Rice reported this week that Aug. 24 has been set as the date when work on the road over the hump will begin.

Mr. Rice said two bulldozers, one grader, trucks and a road crew would be put to work on that date.

In the meantime, an offer of contributed labor has come from several Elkhorn residents.

Ercil Wilson, logging operator, offered to give 40 hours, the Freres-Frank Lumber Co., 40 hours, and the Myers and Myers Logging Co., 48 hours, to reroute and improve the existing road between Elkhorn and Mehama, down the North Fork.

Elkhorn residents were particular-

ly anxious for an early start on the road to Gates so that many children might attend the Gates and Mill City schools.

The demand for a road over the ridge rose last year when several families were cut off from the valley by the collapse of a bridge.

Following completion of the Gates-Elkhorn road, the county crew, Judge Grant Murphy said, would start to work on the Zimmerman road which runs up the hill from Mehama. The road job was requested by school authorities who said it was dangerous for school buses.

Jimmie and Patsy Weddle of Portland are living with Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Kesterson and are planning to go to school in Mill City this fall.

Two stores were planning grand openings next week — on Saturday, Aug. 27.

They are the Hilltop Store, which will complete its installations in its new 80 foot building by then, and the Oleson Dress Shop, a new business which has leased half of the Witt building.

The Hilltop Store is widening its general merchandise business to include an expanded clothing, hardware and meat departments.

The new dress shop is under the proprietorship of Alta and Francis Oleson, who operate a similar business in Woodland, Wash. They will sell dresses, women's suits, hosiery, sportswear, gifts, costume jewelry, infants' wear, and other items.

Mrs. Oleson is a sister of Mrs. Pearl Ketchum. Ramon Roberts is her nephew.

## New Breitenbush Road Opens Vast Virgin Timber Tract

The Idanha Lumber Co. was the low bidder this week at an auction sale in Eugene on 7,500,000 board feet of timber in the Breitenbush area on the Bonneville transmission line right of way.

The bid was on one section of a virgin timber stand and the entire right of way will provide an estimated 20,000,000 feet.

But more important than the timber on the 175 foot right of way is the fact that the Breitenbush development, plus the new forest roads now being built by the Forest Service, top for the first time one of the largest virgin timber stands in middle Oregon.

An estimated several billion feet of Douglas fir and other varieties lie adjacent to the new 24-foot road being built by the Forest Service below and above the Breitenbush Springs resort. The new road also is important from the recreation angle, because it links up with the Skyline Trail leading past scores of beautiful mountain lakes and provides a new tourist loop from Portland, to Mount Hood, to Breitenbush, thence down the North Santiam Highway into the Willamette Valley and back to Portland.

In the timber auction, the Idanha

Lumber Co. bid \$55,556, below three other companies, the M. & M. Woodworking Co., the Harvey Lumber Co. of Idanha, and the Thompson-Henderson Logging Co., of Salem, which is now engaged in clearing part of the reservoir of the Detroit dam. The sale was held by the Willamette National Forest.
