Jackie Bickett received \$2.00 last week as second prize in her 4-H canning 1.

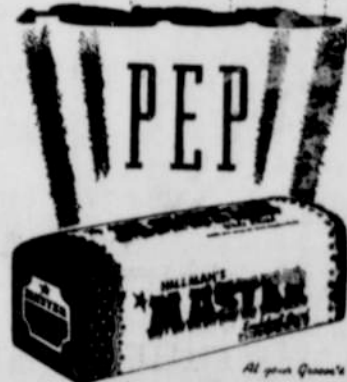

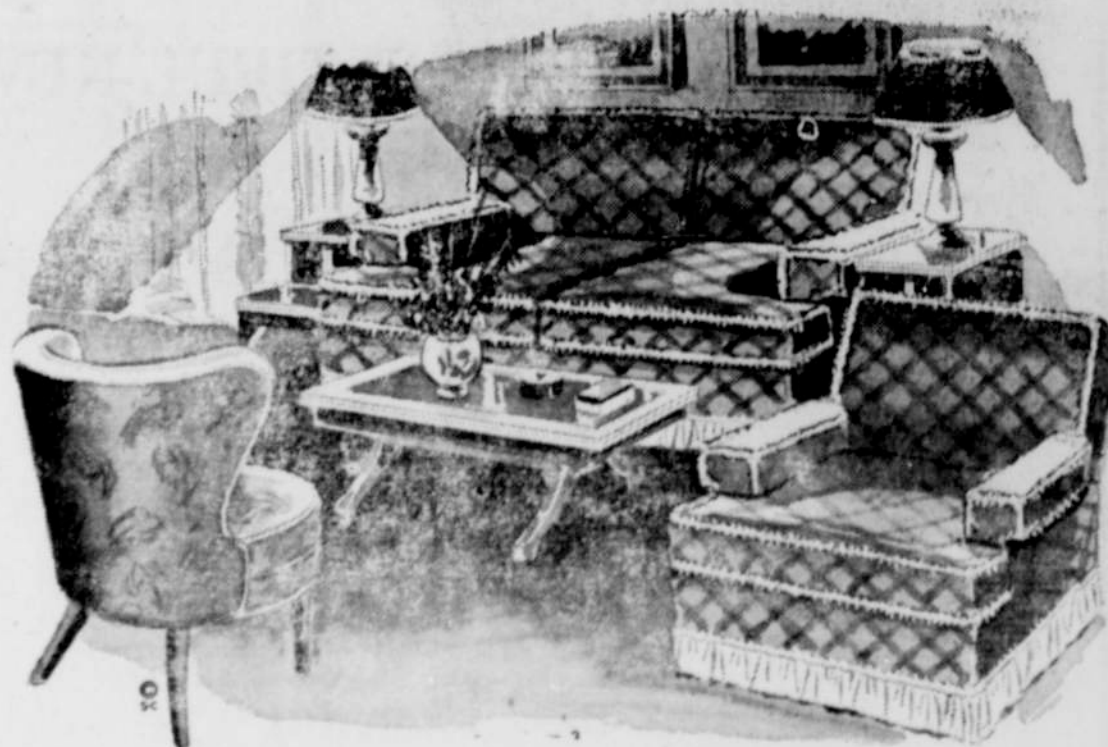
