### **Detroit Rejects** Incorporation

The proposal to incorporate a sixmile upper Canyon area of Detroit and Idanha was defeated in an election there Thursday, 206 to 99.

Edison Vickers, Breitenbush district justice of the peace, was leader of the movement for incorporation. He advocated it on the grounds of a need for public improvements. Opposition centered largely around Idanha, where apponents argued that too much territory had been taken in. The local mill managements there also were opposed.

How the two towns voted was impossible to tell, because both vote in the same precinct.

The election outcome leaves for Detroit the problem, before 1951, of finding a new location or disappearing as a town, because it lies within the reservoir area of the Detroit Dam


Hayward, a logger, will be confined in the hospital at least three month, it was reported.
