

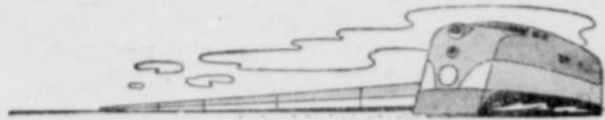

**Game Law
Violations Hit**

The 25,000 acre Abiqua basin which was closed to deer hunters two weeks ago was open again Sunday as game-hungry hunters tore open gates and boldly drove into the area.

The lock on one gate was filled with sticks, a short time after the closure order went into effect, trapping forest service officials and causing them some difficulty getting out.

Cars and hunters were thick in the closed area over the week end, despite the warning that trespassers would be prosecuted.

Hunters all over the county have grumbled and questioned the right of property owners to close forest areas to legal hunters, but a certain number of dishonest sportsmen have caused this hardship to all the others by pilfering, trespassing and illegal hunting.
