**AIMS OF EXTENSION UNITS ARE EXPLAINED**

Home Extension met at the Mehama Women's Club late last week, with Miss Betty Boetticher, county extension agent, demonstrating various window treatments.

Home extension units are under the auspices of Oregon State College and provide an education program of women's groups. These groups elect their own officers and committees to carry out the work of the unit, consisting of home and community betterment.

One committee is known as the Azalea House and is represented in Mehama by Mrs. Reed White. Function of this committee is to raise funds to build a cooperative house at OSC for outstanding 4-H girls.

This year the county is sponsoring an apron sale with each unit donating ten aprons, the money to be used for the building fund.

The A. C. W. W. is another committee which stands for the Associated Country Women of the World. It is an international organization of rural women's organizations from many countries. Its aims are to work together for betterment of rural homes and communities, and to further international relations in every way consistent with the aims of the association.

Margaret Phillips is in charge of the committee on care of children and provides the youngsters present with games, toys and other means of entertainment. Other officers and committees of the Mehama unit are: Chairman—Alma Kirsch, vice chairman—Elizabeth Castle, secretary—Eula Monroe. Project leaders are appointed and receive training by attending meetings in Salem. Project leaders for the future course of making lampshades are Estelle Philippi and Lily Wolfkeil. Another project is oven means with Alma Kirsh and Eula Monroe as leaders.

The next meeting will be a district session to be held in Stayton at the Women's Club. This will be on holiday decoration, and the next Mehama unit meeting will be in January on "giving home sewing a professional look".
