Bonneville Rates Not To Be Raised

Pacific Northwest industries and utilities will continue to enjoy the lowest wholesale firm power rates in the nation for another five-year period, today announced Paul J. Raver, Bonneville Power Administrator. Extension of the current Bonneville rate of \$17.50 a kilowatt-year on all existing contracts to December 20, 1954 (in accordance with provisions of the Bonneville Act for periodic equitable rate adjustments) was officially approved today by Secretary of Interior Julius A. Krug.

Bonneville recommendations for continuance of present wholesale rates for the five-year period beginning this December 20, are based on an analysis of estimated annual revenues and financial requirements of the federal power system through 1954, Raver said. Higher construction costs for the eight power dams to be added to the system during this period will not be a serious factor until 1953.

"Estimated annual revenues are expected to meet all costs of generation and transmission until fiscal year 1954 when the Columbia river power system will include McNary, Hungry Horse, Albeni Falls, Roza, Chandler, Detroit, Big Cliff, and Hills Creek projects," said Raver.

"Construction costs of the new projects as well as transmission facilities are substantially higher than for Bonneville and Grand Coulee, built largely on the basis of prewar prices."
