Keep Oregon Green

Eighty-one Oregon boys and girls, an all-time record number, have been cited by the Keep Oregon Green Association for outstanding efforts during the past summer in reducing man-caused forest fires. Each boy and girl singled out for special honors has been awarded a special "Service Under Fire" badge, according to Albert Wiesendanger, Executive Secretary of K. O. G.

From the canyon were the following 10 youngsters: Darwin and Allen Weathers of Lyons; Kenneth Nygaard, James Beltram, Joyce Watkins and Robert Hotchkiss of Idanha, and Jack and Don Weisgerber, Richard Morris, and Michael Moore of Detroit. Youngest of the winners are two 8-year-olds, Don Wiesgerber, Detroit, and Tommy Hiron, Salem. Marion County had 18 winners to lead the list and Multnomah, with 17 winners, was second highest county. Sixteen Oregon counties had boys and girls who qualified for the highest honor in fire prevention.

All of the 81 winners are members of the Oregon Green Guards, the youth activity of Keep Oregon Green, which now includes more than 30,000 Oregon boys and girls. Secretary Wiesendanger announces that membership rolls are open to any boy and girl in Oregon between the ages of 8 and 16 years, who will send his name and address to the Salem headquarters of K. O. G.

Awards are made each year by the Keep Oregon Green Association to boys and girls who have done outstanding service to their state in fire prevention beyond the usual call of duty. In most cases the youthful citizens reported grass, brush and forest fires. In some cases they actually fought the fires. The alertness of these youngsters has been of tremendous help, Wiesendanger explained, for fires caught before they have a chance to spread, are easy to put out.

To qualify for a Service Under Fire badge, a Green Guard must submit an actual report of his individual effort together with a certification by an adult. Many more of the 30,000 Green Guards undoubtedly qualified for this high honor, Wiesendanger said, and although they did not send in their reports, we do appreciate their contribution to Oregon citizenship.
