## Rod and Gun Club Discuss Fishing at Annual Dinner

The Idanha Rod and Gun club gave their annual Christmas pot luck dinner on the night of December 15th with a large attendance. A short business meeting was held and problems of the coming fishing season discussed.

Mr. Stuart Cooper, assistant director for the relations department of the Oregon state game commission, met with them and helped to solve some of their problems. Mr. Robert Steele of the enforcement division made a number of good suggestions as to building up our lakes for better fishing by giving the young fish a chance to grow for a couple of years and then opening that lake fishing.

Mr. Steele has studied our lakes in this area and is well posted as to the condition of the fishing habitats. Mr. Stuart Couper gave a very interesting talk accompanied with colored pictures showing how the commission stocks the lakes by plane, in some instances by truck, where possible, and by pack train where it is inaccessible by plane or truck.

They also showed the extermination of "trash fish" in certain lakes. Trash fish are sea mammals which propagate fast enough to take over a lake and make it impossible for trout to live.

It was brought out that any fishermen who use minnows for live bait would do well to see this film to find what a detriment it is to put these left over fish back in the lake. This will start a new type of fish to take over the waters from our prized western trout.

## Duck Hunt Area To Open Soon

The recent rains have made it possible to accommodate more hunters each shooting day at the Sauvie Island public shooting grounds operated by the Oregon State Game commission.

This additional hunting space will make it possible to allow a second hunt to those who have already hunted during the first half of the season. Anyone wishing to make a reservation should send their applications to the Portland office of the commission. Reservations will be made on a first come, first served basis as long as space is available.

A heavy concentration of ducks is now present on the island, and with more water on the area, success is expected to be much greater than during the first half of the season.

Shooting dates on the public shooting grounds for the second half of the season are as follows: December 19, 20, 21, 24, 26, 28, 31, and January 1, 2, 4, 6, and 7.

Other chocolate favorites—instant cocoa or chocolate milk, quick chocolate frosting and chocolate sauce—are just as easily made with this sweet cocoa mix.

But speaking of fudge as we were a while back, here are the easy directions for making it, using this new product with its 4-in-1 advantages.

**Quick Fudge**  
1/2 cup sweet cocoa mix  
1/4 cup milk  
1/4 cup butter  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
3 cups sifted confectioners' sugar (about)

Combine cocoa, milk and butter in a saucepan. Heat until butter is melted and cocoa is dissolved, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Add vanilla. Add 1/2 of the sugar, mixing well. Then add remaining sugar and knead with fingers until mixture is consistency of fudge. (If mixture is too soft, add a little more sugar.) Press into greased 8x8-inch pan. Chill. When firm, cut in squares. Makes about 3 dozen pieces.
