### Heard in Court For Gas Victim

Funeral services were held in Klamath Falls Wednesday afternoon for Virgil Lee Johnson, 40, former resident of Mill City, who was killed by asphyxiation December 20 on U. S. highway 97, seven miles south of Gilcrest, when his car stuck in a snowbank.

Also killed in the accident were Jack Virgil Freidley, 38, and his wife, Drucilla, about 30, of Idanha. The three victims had been living in Bend and were traveling from Crescent lake to Bend when the accident occurred.

Johnson was a logging truck driver for various logging concerns while here. He is survived by his wife, Virgie, and four children, Sue, Clorinda, Byron and Joy, who are all residing at Taft, Oregon.
