## Traffic Rules Broken Show Some Decline

A total of 37,843 convictions for moving traffic violations were added to the records of Oregon drivers in 1949, the state driver's license division reported today.

In addition to the traffic violations, 2,013 drivers were convicted of driving while intoxicated, an offense for which their licenses were automatically revoked. Less serious offenses resulted in 811 temporary suspensions of the driving privilege, most of which were based on court recommendation.

Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry explained that judges are required by law to forward records of all traffic convictions to the driver's license division. They become a part of the individual driver's record, together with all accidents in which he is involved. A bad driving record, indicated by too many accidents and convictions, may result in suspension without court action, he pointed out.

A total of 51 different causes for suspension appear in the report, with reckless driving accounting for more than half the actions. Other leading causes were speed in violation of the basic rule, hit and run, failure to have an operator's license, and physical condition.
