On Sunday January 15, 12 inches of new snow fell here making a total of 54 inches. This month there has been a total of 82 inches of snow and 22 inches fell in December. This is according to the official weather reports kept here by Mrs. Earl Parker. The lowest temperature was 9 above zero while the average temperature has been about 20 degrees above zero this month. An additional four inches made a total of 58 inches and snow is still falling. Residents had to shovel the snow from their roofs every day or the weight would break them down.

Due to road and weather conditions bus service has been suspended from Bend for several days.

On January 15 a Bobcat got into the chicken house of Raymond Bophy killing all of his thirteen hens. When Cecil Fullington reported this to Mr. Sophy he got Walt Ball and his hounds and they trailed the cat and killed it about 200 yards from the chicken house. It was small for a bobcat weighing only about 7 lbs.
