Check Sheet for Farm Home Building Issued

Designed as a check sheet to use as an aid before buying, building or remodeling a farmhouse, a new Oregon State college extension mimeograph, number HE 7-302, entitled, "Is This a Good Farmhouse?" is now reday for distribution through county extension offices or from the college.

Written by Mrs. Margaret H. Tul ler, extension rural housing specialist, the 13-page mimeograph can be used as a check sheet for judging either working drawings or an actual farmhouse.

Under such general headings as farmhouse size and shape, entrance locations, circulation, doors, winrangement, space has ben left to make check marks under columns headed excellent, acceptable and poor. Detailed check questions are

enumerated under each heading. Parious check points are illustrated by drawings using a farmhouse plan service.
