fiscal year brought some relief from the intolerable situation, said Raver.

Transmission lines to critical power-deficit areas energized in the fiscal year included the 30-mile Chehalis-Olympia 230 kilovolt and 19-mile Olympia-Shelton 115 kilovolt lines; Salem-Albany 27-mile 115 kilovolt lines; Eugene-Mapleton 38-mile 115 kv line; Grandview-Richland 28-mile 115 kv, and Franklin-McNary 115 kv line.

Pacific Northwest power needs increased three-fold during the eight years just passed with 22 billion kilowatt-hours consumed in 1948 as compared to less than 7 billion in 1940, the report said, with an estimated 47 billion kilowatt-hours needed to meet requirements by 1958.

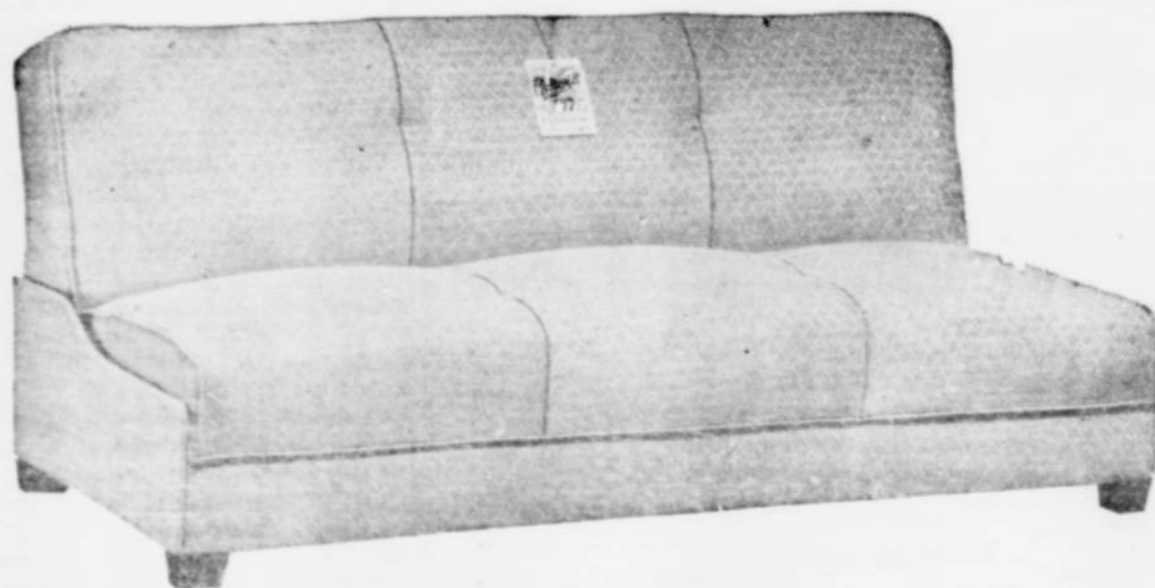
