Lenten Recipes

A delicious garnish for vegetable soup is little balls of smoked cheese rolled in crumbled bacon and dropped into the hot soup just before serving. Vegetables and cheese make a tasty soup combination. The cheese flavor enhances the vegetables and adds good substantial protein, too. Cream of Vegetable soup with cheese is a creamy, flavorful soup, hearty enough to serve as a main dish. The addition of cheese lifts this soup out of the "ordinary" class.

Cream of Vegetable Soup with cheese
Serves 6

2 Tbsp. butter
1/2 cup minced onion
3 Tbsp. flour
2 Tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
4 cups milk
1/4 cup cooked chopped carrots
1 cup diced, cooked potatoes
1/2 cup cooked peas
2 Tbsp. minced parsley
1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
Dash of cayenne
1/4 cup grated Cheddar cheese

Melt butter in top of double boiler, add onion and cook over low heat, until tender. Add flour and seasonings and blend. Gradually add milk while stirring; cook over low heat until smooth and thickened, stirring constantly. Add vegetables, parsley, Worcestershire sauce and cayenne. Heat and sprinkle top with grated cheese. Serve immediately.

Cheese and onion make a very tasty combination—and will be sure to make a hit with the family. Serve it with toasted rolls, vegetable relishes, spiced apple sauce, cookies and a beverage.

Cream of Onion and Cheese Soup
Serves 6

3 Tbsp. butter
2 cups sliced onions
3 Tbsp. flour
4 cups milk
Salt and pepper
1 cup Cheddar cheese, grated

Melt butter in saucepan. Add the onions and cook over low heat, stirring occasionally until yellow. Add flour and blend well. Add milk and cook, stirring constantly until thickened. Season to taste with salt and pepper, add cheese and stir until cheese is melted. Serve with crisp crackers or toast fingers.
