

## Shaw Congress Candidate

David C. Shaw, attorney practicing at Gold Beach and Eugene, today announced his candidacy for congress in the fourth Oregon district. He will seek the democratic nomination



to oppose Representative Harris Ellsworth.

Now a partner of Collier H. Buffington in the firm of Buffington and Shaw at Gold Beach, Shaw practiced law at Eugene and taught at the University of Oregon Law School after resigning from government service in 1947. the OSS, both in the United States and overseas, Shaw worked with underground groups of seven occupied countries in the war against Germany and Japan.

In 1947, the young attorney completed 10 years of service with the NLRB. For the last two years of his service he was assistant director of the filed division of the board, having charge of the administration of seven of the board's regional offices, including New York, Chicago, Seattle and Puerto Rico. Prior to this he was assistant general counsel.

In filing his candidacy, Shaw pledged "sincere and energetic support for the program of President Truman and the Democratic party." "Oregon needs congressmen who will work with the national administration—not against it—if we are to meet our urgent need for electric power, equalization of freight rates for farm and forest products, low-cost housing, schools and jobs," he said.

Shaw specifically declared his sup-price support program, the Columbia port for the administration's farm Valley Administration, repeal of the Taft-Hartley act and equalization of railroad freight rates.

## Doerfler Files for State Senate

Frank A. Doerfler, Salem, member of the house of representatives in the 1947 and 1949 Oregon legislatures, Wednesday filed for the Republican



nomination as state senator from Marion county.

Before making his decision to be a candidate for the state senate this year, Mr. Doerfler talked to numerous farmers, businessmen, and workers thus coming to the conclusion that he could be of greater service in the upper house of Oregon lawmakers.

Mr. Doerfler, one of Oregon's prominent nurserymen, has long been active in civic, agricultural, and community affairs. He is a past director of Marion county war chest, school boards, and Salem Chamber of Commerce; past president of Salem Parent-Teachers association and Garden club; Vice president National Reclamation association for Congressional District No. 1; past president of the Oregon chapter of the National Nursery association; county chairman of the 1950 Red Cross drive which began February 27th.

Mr. Doerfler feels that he is well qualified both by experience and training to represent urban and rural segments of Marion county. He is well aware of the fact that serious problems which will be faced by the Oregon legislature due to the fact that constantly increasing demands for more money for the state purposes would place an even heavier load on the overburden taxpayer.

that such a plan to hold the timber for local processing is designed primarily for the people. Mill or manufacturing interests will not and cannot have any control in the matter. Officials stated "it must be backed by the people if it is to succeed."

## Requires Time

Such action, which would be a "financial godmother" to the Santiam vicinity, could not be established overnight. It will require extensive investigation and complete canyon co-operation. Evidence indicated the plan could not be inaugurated for at least two years. The fact that the plan was not started earlier has been often regretted by many.

## Opposition

Forest officials reminded their listeners in Friday's meeting that they were in line for extensive opposition. The fact that outside lumber interests are now buying and shipping out of this canyon millions of feet of lumber will mean they will not give up this choice revenue without a fight. The officials continued, however, that the local citizens were in the right and needed only to unite to see the plan through.

Such a move was started nearly two years ago in Lakeview and will come to an initial hearing on the tenth of this month. They have met with stiff opposition from large firms that have been, like as here, taking the payrolls into other communities. The control is working successfully in Grays Harbor, Washington.

## Funds Will Be Needed

Because of the enormous task facing the working committee, there will be a considerable need for funds to carry on the required work. A fund raising program is expected to be introduced in the near future.

In foreign policy, Patton urged the United States to think in terms of an expanding economy, and not in terms of scarcity, as a means of supplying the needs of people and disposing of the abundance the United States is capable of producing.

He told the delegates that if he were in Oregon, he would support Wayne Morse.

"You will go a long way to find a man as liberal and progressive as Wayne Morse in Republican Oregon," he said.

Delegates voted to approve a CVA, reaffirmed their opposition to a sales tax, favored income taxes instead of real property taxes as a state base, and more tax aid for public schools.

Ronald E. Jones, Brooks, was re-elected president for his 6th term. J. G. Matzke, Aurora, was re-elected vice president. Arno Spranger, Salem, and Dock Hunt, Boring, were named to the board of directors.

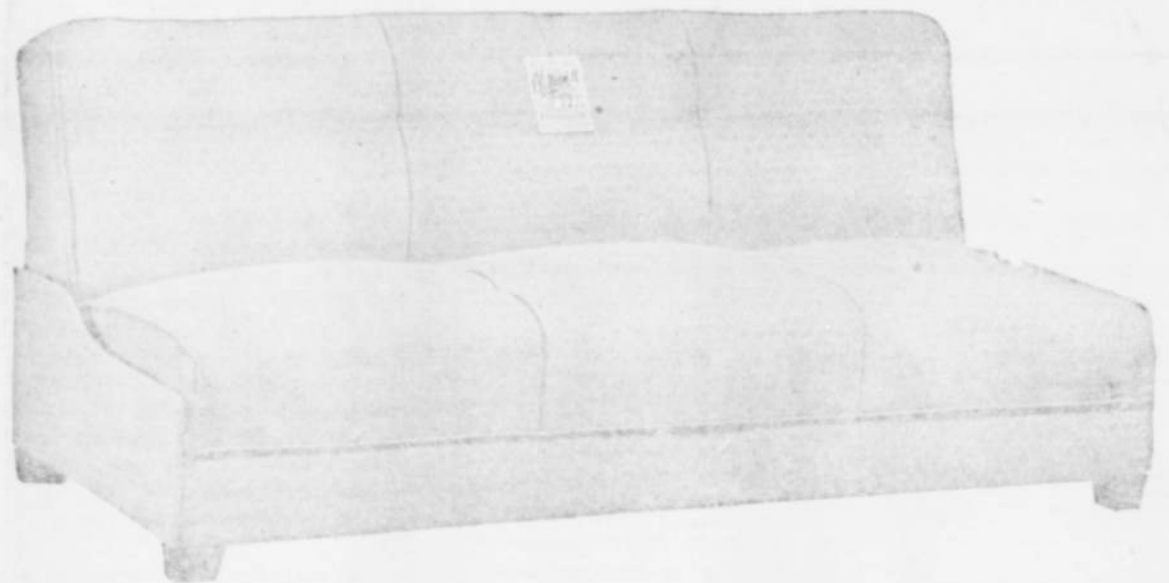
