## Senatorial Race Entered by Shelby

Walter Shelby, prominent Linn county farmer and dairyman, today announced his candidacy for the state legislature as Senator from Linn county on the democratic ticket.

Shelby, a 40 year old native of Linn county has not previously tried for public office. He was graduated from Albany college and was a graduate student at the University of Oregon. He is in partnership with his father and brother and has helped develop an outstanding Jersey dairy herd and grows certified seed crops.

Shelby is Master of Morning Star Grange and Vice-President of the Grange oil company. He is a former president of the Linn-Benton Jersey Cattle club and former director of the Oregon State Jersey Cattle club. He is a member of the Oregon Seed Growers League, serving as chairman of the field crops seed committee in 1948. He is an active 4 H club leader, presently leading the Model Dairy club, the oldest active 4 H club in the U. S.

In announcing his candidacy Shelby pledges full support to the Democratic party platform in Oregon. He favors perfecting the Unemployment Compensation Law; improving the standard of living for the working farmer; eliminating the old age pension lien law; and preserving the initiative and referendum.
