

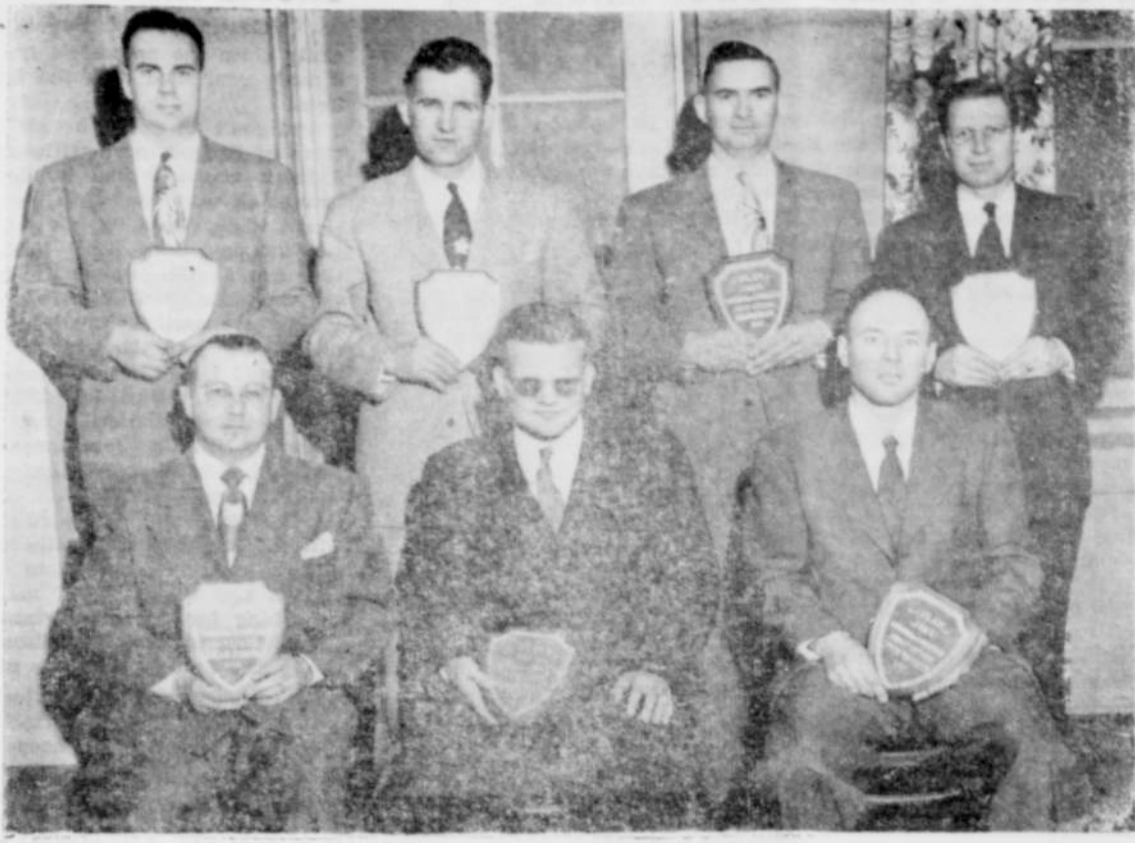
COLLEGE GOSPEL TEAM

Harrisburg Democrats Asks Morse's Viewpoint

Asking that Senator Wayne Morse announce his viewpoint on the McCarthy charges, Dr. Louise A. Wood, Democratic candidate for the U. S. Senate, highlighted the Democratic rally at the city hall in Harrisburg on Sunday.
"Other Republican senators have taken stands against the McCarthy charges," said Dr. Wood. He also discussed the CVA as necessary to maintain the family-sized farm.
Fred Mespelt, Democratic candidate for county commissioner, explained his program for developing county roads whereby a fair distribution of road money would be made to all sections of hte county and where the facts concerning county roads would be available to all.
Earl G. Masn, candidate for the state legislature, pointed out the need for better administration in state enterprises. Other speakers were Paul Plant of Eugene and Miss Margaret Clark of Portland.
