




Striking Picture Emphasizes Lav Witness

# **Trailer Construction Plans Available**

Construction plans for a handy and sturdy horse trailer made of exterior grade plywood are outlined in a new O.S.C. agricultural experiment station circular of information. While designed especially to transport a single horse, the trailer is equally useful for hauling other kinds of livestock within its capacity.

Copies of the publication, "A Plywood Horse Trailer", are available free from county extension offices or from the college. Author is Clyde Walker, formerly with the department of agricultural engineering.

The completed trailer weighs approximately 850 pounds and is so balanced that it can be maneuvered easily when empty by one man. The floor and sides are reinforced for strength and durability. A storage compartment is built in at the front of the trailer. Drawings and specifications are included.
