The meeting will run for 60 nights through August 19, with ten races each night except Sunday. Post time is 7:30 p.m.

One of the finest and fastest groups of greyhounds in local history is entered for this year's meeting. Many veteran favorites as well as a nucleus of outstanding pups are booked. The complete resurfacing of the stadium oval, making it one of the best tracks in the nation, indicate that new records may be posted at all distances this year.

The feature event opening night will be the annual Multnomah Inaugural, won last year by Heavy Record. One of the favorites for the added purse will be Behave Otto, 1950 Multnomah Derby champion.
