Sunday Driving Resulted In Heaviest Death Rate On Oregon's Highways

Sunday topped all other days of the week in traffic fatalities in Oregon last year with 67 fatal accidents, the state traffic safety division has reported.

Saturday ran a close second with 60 fatal smash-ups, the division said. Least fatal accidents were recorded on Tuesday, with a total of 25, and Thursday, with 28.

Heavier rural highway traffic volume due to weekend driving is the main underlying factor, officials said, which increases the chances of mishaps at high speed. Worst killers in 1949 were accidents in which a car ran off the roadway, overturned in the roadway, or struck a fixed object, most of them due to loss of control at excessive speed.

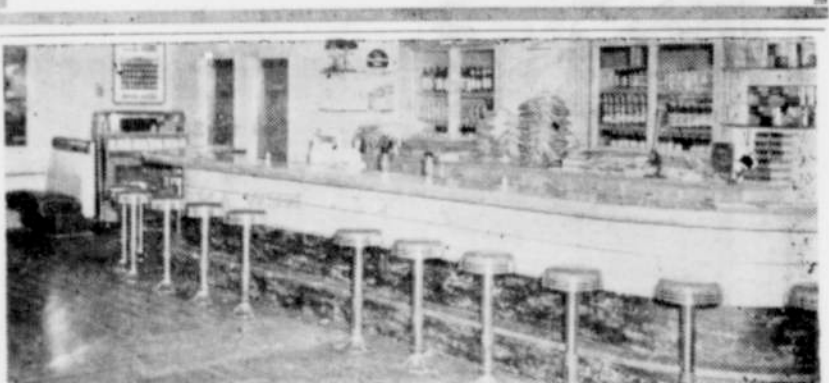
