**RECORD NUMBER OF HOME UNITS STARTED IN MAY**

Homebuilders throughout the country started a total of 140,000 new units in May, a new all-time high for a single month.  
In releasing the figures, the Department of Labor commented that the first five months' volume of new units this year was 52 percent more than the same period last year, pre-seeing a new all-time high in homebuilding during 1950.  
Builders' estimates of construction costs for one-family houses started during the first five months of this year increased to an average of

\$10,700 per unit from \$10,200 per unit for the same period last year.

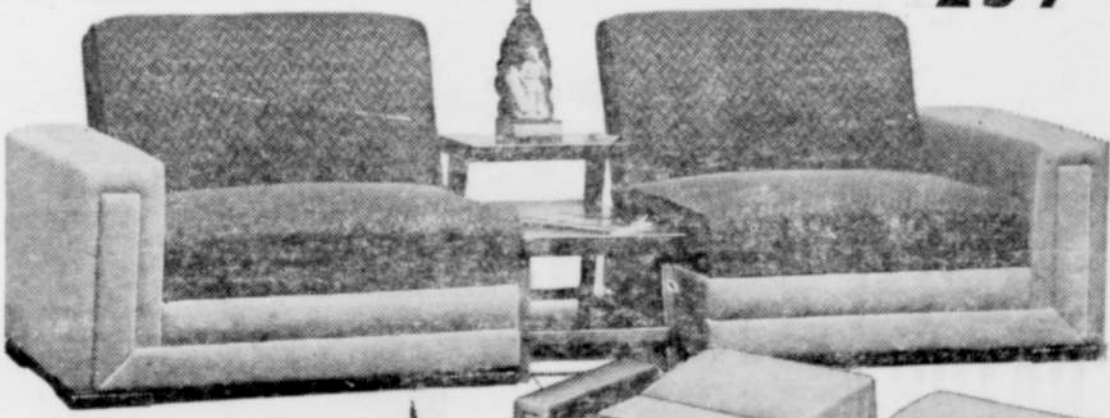
