High School Team To Get Equipment Early Next Week


Football equipment will be issued to Mill City high school prospects at 16, by a 6 to 4 score. 7:30 p.m. next Monday and Tuesday at the high school.





Fishermen Take Large Fish From Clear Lake


The fish were getting bigger in the Mill City Tavern's fishing derby the past weekend.
