HAVE A BETTER KITCHEN

Concerned with her family's health, every homemaker spends many hours keeping her kitchen clean. She washes dishes and cooking utensils carefully and she preserves perishable foods in a modern refrigerator.

Frequently her work is made more difficult by kitchen equipment that gathers dirt and resists thorough cleaning. From a sanitary point of view the sink area can be the worst offender for it is here that the greater part of meal preparation and after-meal cleanup is carried on. A surface that is cracked, cut, or has crevices around the trim into which food particles, dirt and liquids can fall is a threat to the family's health.

That is a major reason why most homemakers prefer a porcelain enameled sink top. Impervious to water and dirt, it easily can be kept clean. But the problem is not entirely solved by porcelain in kitchens where base cabinets adjoin the sink. Unless the crevice between sink and cabinets can be effectively sealed an insanitary condition will be created.

This situation has been corrected in modern kitchens with a "sealer insert." Made of stainless steel, the sealer fits the contours of both the sink and base cabinet. The joint is filled with a waterproof compound, the sealer inserted and securely bolted into place. With this device, the homemaker's cleaning work is made immeasurably simpler.

Where an unbroken counter surface over several base cabinets is not practical, the sealer insert can be used to seal the tops of individual base cabinet tops, maintaining a sanitary surface.
