### HAVE A BETTER KITCHEN

Among the interesting things about kitchen planning are the devices the planners use to deter-mine how a sink, cabinets and other appliances will fit into the space available for them. While it's not difficult to meas-

ure a kitchen and then draw a rough floor plan on paper it is not very satisfactory from the home-maker's point of view. She would like to know what her new kitch-en actually will look like.

Tools Are Fascinating

So the kitchen experts have de-vised a couple of tools that make the job easier, quicker and much more fascinating. One of these is a special measuring rule that measures a kitchen in terms of sink and cabinets as well as in feet and inches. With this device he can tell at a glance what units will fit into

Then the planner goes to work with another still more fascinating device. It is called a Min-A-Kitchen and consists of miniature, built-to-scale plastic models of stand-ard prefabricated steel kitchen units, a range, refrigerator and even lithographed doors and a win-dow. Also included is a scaled floor and sidewalls.

Like Magic Having the correct measurements, the planner sets the walls to simulate the real kitchen and then puts the miniature sink, cab-inets and appliances into place.
