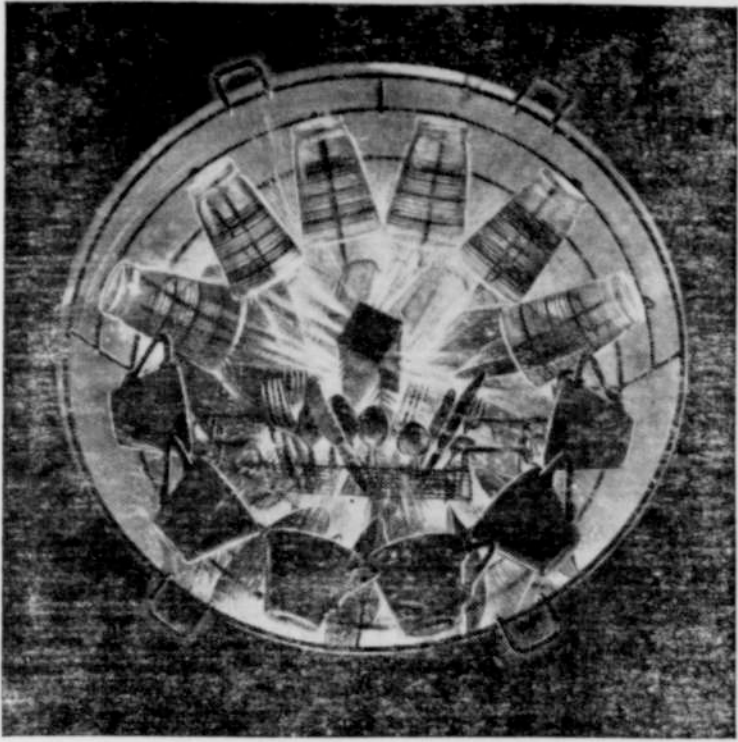


**New Dishwasher Has Whirling Water Tower**
